FOR PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

Concordia High School, Seward, Nebraska is owned and operated by the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. It is maintained to train pastors and teachers for the Church, and it also offers a general course of Christian education. It is accredited by and is a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Concordia High is situated on the campus of Concordia Teachers College. This spacious fifty-eight acre campus is near air, rail, and highway systems. The city of Seward is a typical college town and offers adequate merchandising facilities for students.

Exceptional Living and Instructional Facilities

Although Concordia High School is located on a college campus, it has a faculty whose time and interests are devoted wholly to the high school program. At the same time college facilities are also available to the high school. High School students have their own:

Programs of Study

Concordia High School students may choose one of the following distinctive study programs:

pro-teaching

pro-ministerial

pro-nursing

college preparatory

general

Each of these study programs offers the High School student training in religion and music. Piano and organ instruction is available without additional cost. Instruction for instruments is also available. Field trips, the annual concert tour of the Concordia High School Chorus, and regional contests afford additional opportunities for the student to gain experience and knowledge in the fields of learning which cannot readily be presented in a classroom situation.



Costs of Attending Concordia High School, Seward, Nebraska

Tuition costs include the fees for activities, athletics, laboratories, and medical service for ordinary health needs. Board costs include all meals at the school cafeteria. Lodging includes dormitory room and furniture and bed linens. Laundering of bed linens is included. Students furnish blankets and are responsible for their personal laundry. Washing machines and irons are available. Health insurance is required of all students at a cost of \$5.00 per semester. Students who declare themselves as pre-teacher or pre-ministerial students and intend to enter the full time service of the Church have the benefit of reduced tuition rates. Personal expenses of a student are the only costs not included above. Personal expenses include toilet articles, laundry, clothing, books, recreation, contributions to church, and a reserve for miscellaneous items. Personal funds should be safeguarded in the student bank in the college business office. Methods of payment must be arranged with the Business Officer, and registration is not complete until such arrangements are made. All assessments and instalments are due in advance. At least one semester's tuition and one month's board and room must be paid at the time of registration.

Scholarships and Student Aid

Congregational scholarships are welcomed at Concordia High School. Some districts of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod maintain funds to assist worthy students who are in need of financial assistance. These funds are restricted for use by students preparing for church work. Application for assistance should be made through the local pastor to the district committee controlling the fund. Concordia has a student work program which includes a variety of campus jobs at varying wage rates. However, prospective students who expect to earn a portion of their expenses while at school but have no definite position before coming to the college should generally have means of support for at least one school year.

Method of Admission

If you wish to come to this Christian high school with its distinctive program, write or call the Public Relations Office of Concordia High School, Seward, Nebraska. Admission forms will be mailed to you promptly. These should be completed and returned as quickly as possible. Students seeking admission to the pre-teaching or pre-ministerial programs of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are given priority in dormitories by the Church. Students following other programs can be admitted only if excess housing is available.

It is important that all admission blanks be returned early since admission procedure does not begin until all forms have been received. Entering freshmen must present an eighth grade report card with admission forms. High school students planning to enter sophomore, junior, or senior classes should request the local high school offices to forward a transcript of high school credits immediately. When all admission blanks have been completed and returned, the student will be notified of the action of the Admissions Committee.
